What is the future of the Gulf Coast Baptist College? Ever since COVID we have learned a number o things that will help us to grow and be able to serve more of the Lord's future pastors, missionaries, teachers, counselors, chaplains and church members.

What we have learned is that the future of our school is in long-distance learning. In fact, all of our students in the Fall Semester that just concluded were distance students, including one doctoral candidate who just received his Doctorate of Theology.

This does not mean that we no longer will offer in-person classes. For those who want them such classes will be offered. So, you live in or around the city of Mobile, Alabama, and want the personal relationship that characterizes in-person classes, you can have it.

Frankly, I prefer to teach in-person classes. Having said that, I have learned a couple of things in recent years. [1] Most students these days want distance learning – even if they live near our school. Since the student is the consumer of the product we offer – a godly, quality education – we must provide them with our product in the form they want, or they will seek it elsewhere. [2] I have fond that I enjoy distance teaching more than I thought I would.

Looking Ahead

Pastor, will you help us recruit students? Those whom God has called into vocational Christian work and those who simply want to learn the Bible at a fundamental Baptist, KJV school would benefit much from what we have to offer.

Consider the advantage of some of your God-called church members taking classes with us. Instead of shipping them off to serve in another church far away, you can keep them serving in your church during their time of training. After all, good church workers are hard to find. No need to send them away when you don't have to.

By the way, pastor, you can obtain or increase your theological training without leaving your ministry, and you can do it on your own schedule. The advanced degree you earn will qualify you to teach in a Bible college or seminary after you can no longer carry the heavy burden of a pastorate.

Currently we are offering classes on Zoom, which brings the class to the student, and by directed study, which is good for self-starters and those who have to work on their own schedule and pace. We are also exploring other avenues of distance learning which we will announce in these pages as they become a reality in our school.

By the way, while our Spring Semester officially begins in a few weeks, distance students can begin at any time. Contact our college office to begin the adventure of leaning and training at a Bible-believing, Baptist college – the Gulf Coast Baptist College.

AT THE POINT OF DEATH

Glen Davenport, Th.D. TEXT: John 4:46-54

Today's message will bring us face to face with the part of reality we would rather not have to face. Nonetheless, we see people facing it (death) day after day. It is vitally important for us to know who to turn to when there is a crisis within our homes and families. My family has dealt with five deaths this year. One of my nephews has preached three funerals within the past twelve days.

Without doubt, death is the hardest, the most dreaded thing there is for us to deal with but help is available. My text will show you what one man did. He will be our example.

The story surrounds Jesus' second trip into Cana of Galilee where He had performed the very first MIRACLE of His earthy ministry. He was well known within the area but He did not visit Cana very often.

Upon this certain occasion Jesus was returning from Jerusalem where He had evidently done some wonderful works in the line of miracles. A certain noble man was waiting for Him to come to Cana because he had a son who was 'AT THE POINT OF DEATH.'

When he heard that Jesus was come out of Judea into Galilee he went unto Him and tried to get Him to come down to his house to HEAL his son.

When he approached Jesus about it Jesus knew he needed to see a miracle, however, the man never knew that. He only knew he wanted his son healed. Again he asked Jesus saying, *"Sir, come down ere my son die."*

Jesus wanted to make a believer out of the man so He filled the man's request. He assured the man his son would not die and the story goes on.

As the man went toward his house he met some of his servants who carried good news saying, '*Thy son liveth.*" It was suddenly important for this man to know exactly what time the change for the better had come so he asked about it. When they told him his son started to get better about 1:00 o'clock yesterday, he knew Jesus had performed a miracle for him because at 1:00 o'clock yesterday Jesus said, '*Thy son liveth.*'

This noble man took Jesus as his personal Savior and led his whole household to do the same.

Miracles have had a definite part in establishing Jesus as the 'Healer' and as the 'Savior'. / May have turned to Him AT THE POINT OF DEATH and received healing, perhaps even salvation.

Of curse all men eventually face death and it is by all means imperative to have Jesus with us AT THE POINT OF DEATH.

I. At the point of death - WE NEED TO KNOW WHERE TO FIND JESUS.

The noble man was listening and watching for Jesus to come into his area.

Would you know how to find Jesus if you needed Him quickly?

Are you listening and watching?

II. At the point of death - WE MUST BE AWARE OF OUR GREATEST NEEDS.

The father knew his son was dying and he knew he needed Jesus.

Spiritual needs are usually one's greatest needs.

III. At the point of death - WE MAY NEED SOMEONE TO PRAY FOR US.

The father sought Jesus in his son's behalf.

Do you have someone who can seek Jesus in your behalf? Or could you seek Jesus in behalf of someone else?

IV. At the point of death - SOMEONE WILL WANT TO KNOW WHAT JESUS HAS DONE FOR YOU.

The servant verified the son's healing.

John (John 4:53) verified the family's faith. They ALL BELIEVED - the whole house including the son.

When you are AT THE POINT OF DEATH we are going to want to know about you and your relationship with Jesus.

How is it and how will it be?

Shipping cost is expensive, but it is something we cannot control. I was also able to take some to literature to Bro. Goulding to be used in the churches there.


